2. Agenda Items

1. Call to Order & Quorum Established

- Classroom Update:
 - Work continues on two classrooms adjacent to room 1100.

7. New Business / Discussion Items

A) New Fire Advisory Chair

- Aaron Johnson is stepping down as Chair.
- Chief David Levin (CalFire) was announced as the new Chair for the committee.

B) New Fire 208.6 Class

- Certificate of Achievement will be offered through a new combined course.
 - Two separate courses for Firefighter I (208.4) and Firefighter II (208.5) are being merged into one course, Fire 208.6.
 - Allowing the SRJC to offer 4 options to attain the FFI & FFII certificates
 - The course is equivalent to a 16-unit class and provides equivalency testing for certificate completion.
 - The new course allows employees to obtain certification without going through a full academy.
 - Director Sebastiani is working with SRJC to finalize the course for scheduling and admissions.
 - The course is anticipated to run annually, with options for out-of-state applicants to pursue reciprocity through additional certification (Wildland Certificate).
 - Director Sebastiani spoke to the members of the committee addressing the Fire Academy rules/regulations regarding the 10 sponsored spots.
 - Vote was taken to move forward with the class being approved.

8. Updates

A) Fire Program (Program Director Update)

1. New Tower Planning:

- SRJC is planning to build a **5-story fire tower**, with the hope of breaking ground in early spring.
- Rachel Smith is assisting with grant processes.
- 2. 2022/23 Grant Update:

- New storage containers and racks for student turnouts are now in service.
- A second propane-fueled prop for the fire tower has been approved by the Board of Trustees.

3. Live Fire Materials:

- New materials are being sourced for live fire exercises.
- 4. SFT Update:
 - The Fire Program continues to update its curriculum to parallel NFPA standards, with the **IFSTA 8th Edition** expected in July 2025.
 - Instructor-to-student ratios are being updated in most SFT classes.
 - Certified Instructor I is now required for lead academy instructors.
 - Updates were provided on succession planning and peer-based suicide awareness training through Cal-JAC.

5. Hybrid Classes:

• Efforts are underway to introduce new hybrid courses and transition existing ones to this format.

6. Fire Scholarships:

• A total of **\$7,000** has been allocated for scholarships in the 2023/24 academic year.

7. Fire Program Donations:

• The Academy has received donations of equipment and materials from various departments, saving over \$70,000.

B) Fire Academy Update (Academy Coordinator)

• Graduate Employment:

- 15-20 graduates from previous academies have been hired by local fire departments.
- 106th Academy (40 Students):
 - 2 students failed, with 38 students continuing.
 - Graduation is scheduled for **December 20, 2024**, at 10:00 AM.
- 107th Academy:
 - The application window closes on **October 1, 2024**, at 11:59 PM.
- Academy Donations:
 - Previous academies have contributed to building firefighter survival props, saving the program significant costs.

C) Sonoma Training/Operations Officers (Spencer Andreis)

• The group has not met in six months due to an increase in fires. No new updates were provided.

D) Marin Training Officers (Jason Hatfield)

- Ongoing fire safety and survival training.
- A new 6-7 person academy will start on **December 2, 2024**.
- County-wide training and live burns are planned for October 24-25, 2024.

E) Mendocino Training Officers

• Prepping for the upcoming academy while managing a busy fire season.

F) Fire Prevention Officers

- Fire Protection Week is next week, with planned community outreach efforts.
- CAL Chiefs Association is forming a fire marshal group with upcoming training in Sacramento.

9. Roundtable/Announcements

- Discussions centered around the need for:
 - New **email lists** for class updates each semester.
 - Peer-to-peer relationships and professional experts to assist with training.
 - Increasing diversity in the fire program, with a focus on gender and racial representation.
 - Continued efforts for donations, including equipment like MSA bottles.
 - Distribution of **class flyers** for the spring semester.
